

### **Proposed Change of Legal Status of BUGB charity**

The Trustees of the Baptist Union of Great Britain have been consulting with key stakeholders and members of BUGB regarding the proposed change to the legal status of the BUGB charity. ## Deposit Accounts

The Baptist Union Corporation Directors have agreed to a relaunch of the Baptists Together Church Deposit Accounts from 3 April 2017 that will now include a 3 Month Notice Account and a 1 Year Fixed Account alongside the Standard 7 Day Notice Account. Advertising of these **new accounts is currently on the BUGB website**, and all churches will receive details with their annual subscription letters in due course. The interest rates applicable to each of these account is also available on the BUGB website, as are the Terms and Conditions for these accounts.



## National Minimum Wage and National Living Wage increases from April 2017

The annual uplift in the National Minimum Wage and National Living Wage (for those aged 25 and over) come into force this month, with the National Living Wage rising from £7.20 to £7.50 per hour. The new hourly minimum rates are as follows - Age 25 and over: £7.50; 21-24: £7.05; 18-20: £5.60; Under 18: £4.05; Apprentice: £3.50.



## Support for Study

Accredited Ministers who want to study for a degree at a higher level than they have already achieved are reminded that our Union offers grants from the Further Studies Fund to help with the costs. These are at a fixed rate for taught Masters and a proportion of fees for research degrees. ## Equipping Christian Leadership in an Age of Science

This three year funded ecumenical project, based at St John's College, Durham University aims to resource all levels of Christian leadership in their engagement with questions, challenges and opportunities created by science. The project needs to hear from Baptist leaders and there is an opportunity for you to contribute to this significant piece of research by filling in a **10 minute online survey**. The survey is open to all Baptist ministers - who do not need to be from a scientific background.




### **Justification and Justice Symposium - Saturday 8 April**

### **Sam Sharpe Lecture - Saturday 7 October**




### Who Do You Say I Am?
