Coastal Expression is a new mission agency that will connect and support those seeking to embody the good news incarnationally in under-churched and marginalised coastal communities. 


We are continually updating our guidelines for churches to reflect the latest Government guidance and ensure that everyone is kept safe.


BRF Daily Prayer


Christian Council on Ageing: Conference Calls - Tues 15 June
