We pray as you join with many others seeking Jesus on the hillside, you will know the power of God's kindness and faithfulness.


We pray together; may we know joy and peace as the Spirit of God leads us.

Politics in the Pulpit?




Resources from Embracing Age


New show from LAMPS Collective this summer!
